For 11 years I have been a member of the IOBA Committee as Treasurer and Chairman for the last 9. A position I have tried to uphold with honour and respect for all that the IOBA Stands for. It was never going to be easy following in the footsteps of one William (Bill) O'Leary, but I would like to think that in the main I achieved almost all that I had hoped for. All be it one aspect from the past has come to haunt my thoughts more recently.

Just a few of the most enjoyable parts of being the Chairman were, organising the annual dinner inviting and hosting the JSMTC Commandant and his guest and not least of which the Chairmans message in the Newsletter, when that stopped and the events that have followed since have had a serious effect on my motivation and leadership desire.

I have shared some very memorable, treasured moments with you especially those I have subsequently come to call friend. The Sea Cadet awards in all corners of the UK, the most memorable being the trip to Scotland, just the raw emotion that overtook the room when we handed over the cheque will never be forgotten.

Having served in two of the armed forces as a Royal Naval Submariner and Combat Medical Technician in the Army I finished my Military career in 1997 and then discovered I had not only a passion for saving lives but a want and desire to make the world of work a better place, with the rest of my career dedicated to health, safety and risk management, a role that has seen me employed by some of the worlds global giants many of whom are involved in Motor Sport and achieved personal recognition for outstanding contribution to the cause on multiple occasions.

I took early retirement in December 2022 having finished my career where it all started in boats, only the luxury world of Yacht manufacturing perhaps a little more luxurious than a diesel-powered O Class submarine. I had hoped to complete a few of the things left on my bucket list – the ashes series in Australia being one. But alas sadly life catches up with you and it is with sad regret that I hand over the baton of leadership to another due to a declining and debilitating health condition.

Years of pounding the parade square, jumping over obstacles and an over-indulgence with the sports field have played havoc with my skeletal system, which has determined its time to be a lot more sedentary, but that is also a problem as I cannot sit for long periods either.

A serious arthritic condition in my spine makes long journey's impossible without invoking more pain. 11 years on from the first diagnosis I have another MRI scanplanned for May 2025 and as I write it is unclear as to what the long-term prognosis maybe.

So, time is now spent with my other great passions in life, stamp collecting and watching my grandchildren grow up. Not quite the final chapter I had hoped for but one I will truly enjoy to the fullest.

To each of you, I wish you all health and happiness, never forget you once were and always will be "Inde boys"

TRESURER'S UPDATE

With great delight I bring some positive news although membership numbers are down, payments are up thanks to an initiative to reintroduce the annual membership fees of £15/annum (£10 over 65). At time of writing the membership payments received -£1,056, but there is more to do to ensure we can meet the commitments made, however having a current balance >£23,000.

Point to note is we will not report funds on a JULY to JUNE period. This meets the time period between AGMs and the Reunion dinner.

Allocated funds for 2024-25 (Jul-Jun) are as follows:

- Sea Cadets Award £1500
- R. Griffin Fund £300 (£1,050 allocated)
- Poppy appeal £1000
- New Standard £695
- Restoration works £550 Indefatigable Bible.
- Fixed running costs ~£350

Income streams:

- General donations £300
- Merchandising £1400 (Less material costs)
- Raffle and other fund raising achieved in 2023-24 period >£1900

Reunion meal tickets (£58.50 per head) income is not reported within the financial figures for this year as this should be neutral on the balance sheet. However the 2025 reunion is projected to operate at a significant loss (those that attend will have an excellent time anyway), so greater reliance on fund raising for the association will be leaned upon to ensure continued annual events can continue.

Your continued involvement and "in it together" ethos is very important to us.

REMINDER TO ALL - A motion was carried at the 2024 AGM where it was voted to re-establish collection of membership fees. The committee thanks all those who continued to contribute to the association voluntarily over the last few years. This certainly ensured the ongoing operations of the association could continue.

8. MEMBERSHIP – George Brown, Treasurer & Membership Secretary

The membership stands at 252 Members as at 31 Dec 2021

No new member applications this past year, with no difference made to members numbers since the subscription fee was suspended.

Due to having zero new member applications this last year, and no significant difference on membership since subscriptions were suspended in light of attracting new members, the Treasurer and Committee forward a motion to reinstate annual membership fees of £15.

Steve Hobson, attending first AGM/Reunion confirms that due to having no financial obligation to join the IOBA, then he felt there was no incentive to sign up for membership.

Currently the IOBA have two mainstreams of income, being merchandise sales and monies raised at the annual dinner. Although the accounts are currently healthy, members are reminded that each year the members numbers are naturally reducing and also the Sea Cadet Award has not been awarded for the last four years, and due to the costs of insurance, attending funerals and events etc. As a n organization, we need to look at other funding options in order to maintain the IOBA.

Reminder given that the monetary value of the Sea Cadet Award to be given is to be voted for at every AGM.

The motion to reinstate the annual subscription of £15 was put to the members present and carried by majority vote.

The Treasurer advises that the current membership database is out of date and requires a full review of current members and contact details as well as identifying those who have continued to pay annual subscriptions since the fee was suspended as some members were unaware of the suspension being in place.


